Put the objects into equal groups using two trays or plates.

- say how many groups there are.
- say how many objects are in each group.
- say how many objects there are in total.

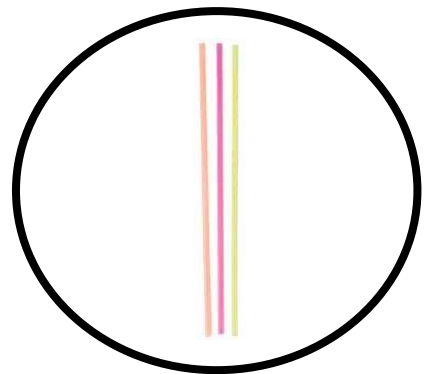
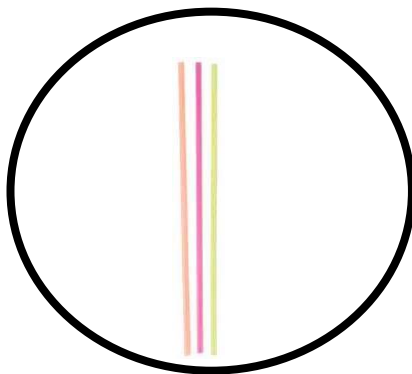
